
## Visit to the Basilica of our Lady of Guadalupe



You will have the opportunity to visit, by a pedestrian walk with a specialist in the subject guide, the biggest shrine in America, which was built near the hill of Tepeyac where Our Lady of Guadalupe is believed to have appeared to Saint Juan Diego. The new Basilica houses the original tilma (or cloak) of Juan Diego, which holds the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe. One of the most important pilgrimage sites of Catholicism, the Basilica is visited by several million people very year, especially around 12 December, Our Lady of Guadalupe's Feast day.



# Visit to the Pyramids of Teotihuacan



In this magical visit you will see Teotihuacan, known today as the site of many of the most architecturally significant Mesoamerican pyramids built in the pre-Columbian Americas. Apart from the pyramids, Teotihuacan is also anthropologically significant for its complex, multi-family residential compounds; the Avenue of the Dead; and the small portion of its vibrant murals that have been exceptionally well-preserved. Teotihuacan was the largest city in the pre-Columbian Americas, with a population estimated at 125,000 or more, making it at minimum the sixth largest city in the world during its epoch.
